

ONLINE TEACHING ROUTINE: SONG

Before Class

- **Connect with students** by sending them a message or short video with instructions to:
 - **review** the unit's vocabulary and grammar.
 - **read** the song lyrics and **look at** the photo on the song page of the **Student's Book**.

In Class

- **Build community.** Allow time for students to **greet** you and one another. Have them **share** any news since the previous class.
- **Mute** all students before beginning instruction. **Unmute** as needed throughout the class.
- **Display** the song lyrics on the **CPT** (:).
- Have students **open** their **Student's Books** to the song page. Have them **scan** the page to look at **titles**, **photos**, and other **text or graphic elements**.
- Ask What do you think this song is about? What do you know about [topic of the song]? Have students raise their hands to respond and unmute them one at time. Or, invite students to type their ideas into the chat bar and select several to read aloud.
- Play the song track (:) and have students read along with the lyrics.
- Use the **highlight tool** or **pencil tool** to follow along with the song's lyrics on the CPT.
- Play the song video (:). Have students stand up and do the motions on the video.

Wrap Up

- Play the **song track** (:) again and have students sing the song and do the motions.
- **Build community.** End the class by having students **say goodbye** to one another and to you. Invite them to **share** any exciting plans they have between now and the next class.
- Ask students to prepare for the next lesson and preview the next page in the Student's Book.

After Class

- Have students complete the Student's Book activities independently. Have them take a photo of their work and email it to you or upload it to your online classroom.
- Have students connect with their partner using videoconferencing or telephone to complete personalized or open-ended activities.

Additional Practice

- Have students record themselves singing and doing the motions for the song. Have them email you the recordings or upload them to the online classroom. Encourage students to dress up or use props to make their video more fun.
- Encourage students to **personalize** the song. Have partners or small groups **change** words in a verse so that it connects with their lives or culture. Again, have them **record** these personalized versions and share them with you and the class via email or the online classroom.
