HBI/NAHB has partnered with The Ohio State University (OSU) for instructor certification and the National Occupational Competency Testing Institute (NOCTI) for student certification; both are offered online. If your instructor and students become certified, your program is eligible for credentialing as well.

INSTRUCTOR CERTIFICATION

HBI/NAHB offers instructor industry certification to ensure consistency in instructor teaching/training methodologies and knowledge competency when teaching to the HBI/NAHB National Skill Standards contained throughout the RCA Series curriculum. Michael completed high school and attended vocational school studying carpertry. He later obtained his Associate degree in Occupational Studies from the State University of New York at Delhi.

MICTORY

After working as a carperter and woodworker far a number of years. Michael established his own business; he is the sole owner of Michael E. C. Surgay Carpenter Centractors, Inc. Michael's company does basic framing to complex remodeling and additions, working on \$3-\$4 million homes. A recipient of the Community Builders Association of New Jener's Sub-Contractor of the Year Award, Surgay is one of New Jensey's specialized carpentry contractors.

ON THE JOB

In a typical day, Michael says, "I need to be on the job. I don't just set up my guys and leave. I have a tool belt on every day. People pay me to be there and work. If



I'm not there, the work doesn't get done. If you get the jeb, you need to be there and run the job *

BEST ASPECTS

Nichael has a deep commitment to his work: "You really need to enjoy it and be passionate about it. I don't think it's with every type of job. In carpentry, you are using your head and your body. There's no price to pay for the wear and tear on your body. Every 2 × 10-24 feet piece of wood you need to carry with passion. If you show up for work in the morning, and mu've thinking that it's too heavy or it's too cold outside you won't do it."

CHALLENGES

While Wichael shares that the carpentry business has been good to him, he explains that building a business is stressful: "When I started out, I lived at my parents' house. I made pothing for the first three years, but my guys always get paid. I get my tools and paid my insurance. If I hadn't lived at home, there's co way I could have done it." Mithael says he hult his reputation doing jobs that he thought he could do and being honest with his bids, breaking down each job, figuring out the cost of materials and employees. At first, he took on small jobs, which turned into bigger jobs He started out as sole proprietor and then became corporation with employees. "Now it's a different ballgame. You have to have liability insurance. It's a business," he notes,

Michael also comments on the challinges of dealing with changes in the economy: "You can't just frame now There's not enough work. Four years ago, Surgey Construction was doing seven to eight custom house each year. Now we're only doing three or four a year " response to the economic downtam. Michael fue

The safe and proper use of the tools used to install residential electrical systems is very important. If a tool comes with an owner's manual, read it! The place where you bought the tool is also an exceller source to find out how to safely and properly use the tool. A residential electrician should co he following items:

- Use the right tools for the job. Be sure that they are in good working order.
- · Use only those power tools for which you have received proper instruction
- Use tools for their intended purpose (for example, pliers are not to be used for hammering) (Figure 1-26).
- · Portable power tools should be provided with a three-prong grounding plug for attachment to a grounding type receptacle unless it is a double-insulated power tool.
- · Sharp-edged or pointed tools should be carried in tool pouches and not in clothing pockets.
