Presentation

Affirmative

I/You/We/You/They	start work at 9. go to bed at 11.
He/She/It	starts work at 10. goes out on Friday evening.

Negative

I/You We/You/They	don't	walk to the office.
He/She/It	doesn't	work at night.

have/has

The verb *have* is irregular:

He has a job. ✓

~~*He haves a job.*~~ ✗

Spelling rules:

Add -s to most verbs in the present simple third person (*he/she/it*) form:

live → *lives*, *start* → *starts*, *work* → *works*

Add -es to verbs ending in -ch, -o, -s, -ss, -sh and -x:

watch → *watches*, *go* → *goes*, *finish* → *finishes*

TIP *doesn't* = *does not*
