I	'm not	Chinese. from Italy.
He / She / It	isn't	
You / We / They	aren't

Short answers

Yes,	I am.
	he / she / it is.

TIP With everyday English, use contracted forms:

I'm = *I am* *She isn't* = *She is not* *They aren't* = *They are not*
